School Information

AGBU Manoogian-Demirdjian School (AGBU MDS) is a college preparatory school owned and operated by the Armenian General Benevolent Union, the largest Armenian philanthropic organization in the diaspora. The school was founded in 1976 as an elementary school, adding one grade each year to reach high school level in 1987. The school has graduated nearly 1800 seniors to date. Parents of students hail from many different countries of the world, including Armenia, Bulgaria, Cyprus, Egypt, Georgia, Iran, Iraq, Lebanon, Romania, Russia, Syria, Turkey, United Arab Emirates and parts of central and South America. The school has been accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges since 1992.

High School Faculty

Of the 36 faculty members in the high school, 100% either hold a B.A. or B.S. degree, 65% hold master's degrees, and 9% hold doctorate degrees. Many teachers have been professionally published and considered experts in their respective fields. AGBU MDS faculty have received regional and national recognition for charitable activities and teaching excellence. The ratio of students to teachers is 12:1.

Grading

The school year is divided into two semesters and classes meet daily. AGBU MDS issues 3 progress reports every semester, 5 weeks apart; however, only semester grades appear on the student's permanent transcript. Grades are calculated on a 4-point scale and weighted 1-point for courses designated as "Honors" or "Advanced Placement."

Service Commitment

Students must complete 80 community service hours as part of their graduation requirements. This obligation exists to encourage fulfillment of the AGBU Manoogian-Demirdjian School Mission. The vast majority of students choose to exceed this service requirement.

Graduation Requirements

Students are expected to complete the following, fulfilling all A-G requirements:

Any core subject courses, with a semester grade of D or F, must be repeated prior to graduation. Courses repeated outside of AGBU are not shown on student transcripts and are not factored into the student's cumulative GPA. Additionally, seniors cannot have a D or F, as a semester grade, during their senior year in any core subject and graduate.

GPA & Class Rank Information

The highest academic cumulative weighted GPA in the Class of 2026 is 5.01. The Class of 2026 may be the most academically gifted class in AGBU history with three National Merit Semifinalists and twelve students with above a 4.70 weighted GPA. Given the rigorous nature of the curriculum and the small size of the senior class, AGBU Manoogian-Demirdjian School does not rank its students. Off-campus summer or transfer grades from other schools are not included in the GPA.

Advanced Placement (AP) Program

There are a total of 17 Advanced Placement (AP) and 9 UC-approved honors courses offered. Some courses may not be offered every year due to scheduling and enrollment issues. Advanced Placement Results for 2025

In May 2025, 65% of our 10th, 11th, 12th grade students took 290 exams. 11/15 AP tests offered had pass rates of 90% or better. Our school was recognized for achieving the highest AP honor roll status, Platinum, by the College Board.
