Down the Rabbit Hole is an engaging and accessible guide that blends personal insight with practical tools for navigating today's digital world.

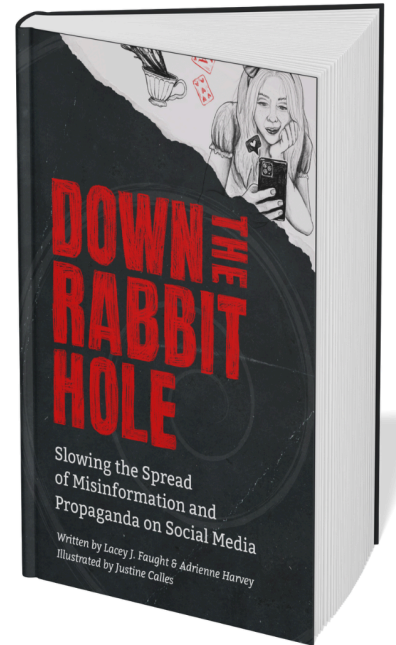
