"Desiree's Baby" Comprehension Questions

- 1. Identify the point of view from which the narrative is told.
- 2. As Désirée becomes a young woman, Armand's feelings for change. He fell for her "as if struck by a pistol shot"; his feelings "swept along like an avalanche, or like a prairie fire." What do these figurative expressions have in common?
- 3. Refer once again to the figurative expressions in the previous question. What is the author implying about the relationship between Désirée and Armand?
- 4. How does Chopin establish a setting that is influenced by French culture?
- 5. Désirée's father has a frank conversation with Armand about Désirée's heritage. Explain the irony of Armand's response.
- 6. According to Désirée, why specifically is Armand proud of his son immediately following his birth?
- 7. According to Désirée, how had the birth of her child influenced Armand's behavior?
- 8. Several months after the birth of her child, Désirée senses that things are not right at home. What specific details contribute to her sense of concern?
- 9. Identify the incident that causes Désirée to have an epiphany regarding her son.
- 10. Refer to Désirée's letter to Madame Valmonde on page four (pasted below). Given Désirée's characterization throughout the story, make a logical inference. What is the cause of the agony Désirée expresses?

"My mother, they tell me I am not white. Armand has told me I am not white. For God's sake tell them it is not true. You must know it is not true. I shall die. I must die. I cannot be so unhappy, and live."

- 11. What motivated Armond's parents to withhold the truth from him?
- 12. Given the story's conclusion, make a logical inference. What is implied about the values of Armand's father? Explain.
- 13. Given the fate of Désirée, make a reasoned claim. Why does she commit suicide when it is objectively clear that her adoptive family loves her (and her child) unconditionally?
- 14. How is the revelation about Armand foreshadowed earlier in the narrative? Cite specific textual details.
